Papillons are a medium coated breed. Medium coated dogs require extra nutrients and minerals for a healthy skin and coat. These products will nourish your Papillon's skin and coat and make it shine while leaving the texture of the coat intact. With regular bathing you will experience less matting and breakage and easier brush outs!

For best results, follow the Iv San Bernard bathing instructions sheet. Products should be diluted 1 part product to 3 parts water and allowed to sit on the dog for a full 5 mins before rinsing.

Orange PEK Conditioner – Add this in with your conditioner to help strengthen your dog's coat to prevent breakage. You can also mix with water to create a great hydrating spray for preventing breakage and matting between baths.

H270 Spray – This deep penetrating, hydrating spray is a must for any Papillon owner! It contains Jojoba oil, Avocado oil, and Bamboo extracts that are ideal for detangling and shine. This versatile spray can even be used as a scissoring spray during grooming!

Black Passion Argan Oil – A few drops go a long way in polishing your Papillon's coat with this nourishing argan oil. It will hydrate the coat and nourish the skin. Pair with a good brushing with a boar bristle brush and you won't believe the shine!
